Purpose of consultancy:	UNFPA-Jordan is looking for a qualified individual to provide technical assistance to write Human-Interest Stories (HIS) highlighting the impact of UNFPA's Sexual and Reproductive Health (SRH) Clinic and Women and Girls Safe Space (WGSS) i Zaatari Camp for Syrian Refugees that is funded by ECHO.
Scope of work:	Objectives of the Assignment
(Description of services, activities, or outputs)	UNFPA would like to document the achievements realized in implementing these projects in a structured manner, focusing on identifying the specific factors or success, summarizing the actual actions being undertaken on the ground describing the impact of these interventions on the lives of those whom it is being implemented for, and to highlight the role of ECHO's fund. These stories will be shared with partners and the general public. The specific objectives of the assignment are as follows:
	 Document human-interest stories (HIS) from the implementation of the projects in terms of improving the reproductive health status or individuals and improving access to quality GBV services. Create an Information Pack from compiled materials to be used in reporting to the donors and to be used on UNFPA's digital platform (social media and website).
	Outputs/Deliverables
	The following deliverables are expected from the consultant:
	 Production of human- interest stories on the SRH Clinic and the WGSS in English and Arabic. The stories must include powerful quotes from beneficiaries and IPs. The story narrative should be written in a creative way which needs to be supported by quality photos. Prepare a short narrative or profile before writing a full story. Draft the story, and submit for comments. Incorporate the comments from UNFPA's Communication team and relevant Programme teams. Submit the final version (both – English and Arabic) including photos with captions. The first story to be submitted after one week from receiving the permit to enter Zaatari camp. The total number of required stories is, tentatively, five stories (subject to change). The last story to be received by 15 August 2021.

Place where services are to be delivered:	Zatarai Camp

Proven experience in working with international organisations (successful experience in working with UN agencies is an added advantage); High sense of journalistic ethics and in-depth understanding of human right issues.

Consultant will be responsible for his/her transportation for all associated UNFPA work on this consultancy.

A sample of prior similar work done by the consultant as individual is required along with a financial proposal indicating the cost per 250 words (one page).
